Annual WoodStoke Festival Featuring Artist Chris Gustin & Celebrating Gulf Coast Kiln Walk's 20th Anniversary

Artist Chris Gustin's love of ceramic arts began early where he shared an enthusiasm in making tiles and objects in the pottery factories managed by his parents in Los Angeles, California.

His education and career spans 40 years and two coasts. He has studied among

artists such as John Mason, taught in New York and Boston, and is one of the founding members of the Watershed Center in Ceramics, a residency program in Maine. Gustin holds a masters degree in fine arts and his work ranges from functional wares to exquisite tiles, as well as other inspirational expressions.

As the featured artists at the Annual WoodStoke Festival, Gustin takes on the task of loading the Anagama Kiln. He has a history firing his own art in the Ananagama style since 1995.

"It is so great to have a real expert here (Gustin), loading the kiln and teaching everyone how it works. He also rebuilt the kiln in the back and front to make it more efficient," Brenda Stokes, Gulf Coast Kiln Walk.



Thank you to new GCKW Members and Donors and everyone who attended the 2022 WoodStoke Festival. Thanks to our many volunteers at the event.


